

Tuesday, August 15th, marks the Solemnity of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary, a holy day of obligation and one of the principal Marian feasts of the liturgical year.

The Festival of
Assumption celebrates
the Church's ancient
doctrine holding that
Mary, Mother of the
Lord, at the moment of
her passage to eternity
was mysteriously
assumed, soul and body,
into Paradise at the
beaconing of her Divine
Son, Jesus. The
Assumption is enshrined

in the Church's devotional life as the Fourth Glorious Mystery of the Rosary, and along with Mary the Church proclaims God's praise in these magnificent words attributed to her in Luke's Gospel: "Henceforth all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me" (Lk 1:48).

The Catechism of the Catholic Church further explains, "The Most Blessed Virgin Mary, when the course of her earthly life was completed, was taken up body and soul into the glory of heaven, where she already shares in the glory of her Son's Resurrection, anticipating the resurrection of all members of his Body" (CCC, 974). Contemplating the grace of this divine mystery, let's join the whole Church in giving thanks to God on the Solemnity of the Assumption for accomplishing such great things for us - Holy is His Name!

PRAYING FOR PEACE

This does not mean that our faith is a private affair with no impact on public life! We have the ability to freely exercise our religious beliefs in accord with our conscience. Not only do we have the option to do so, but we also have the responsibility.

We're called to imitate Christ in every area of our life, not compartmentalize our faith. This means acting with respect and honoring the common humanity in all we encounter. It means recognizing the person behind the politics. It also means standing up for the truth of human life and dignity and advocating for just policies that serve the common good. The Vatican has produced a "Compendium of the Social Doctrine of the Church." It contains more detailed exposition of how our Catholic faith relates to various aspects of public life.
