GOSPE

During Mass you will hear the priest and people say, "Lord, have mercy. Christ, have mercy. Lord, have mercy." It means, "Lord, forgive me." You are human. You will make mistakes. God is proud when you are honest and admit that you did something wrong. He smiles when you forgive yourself and others. He frowns when you talk and act like you are better than others. God wants you to do right.







The Holy Land is often called the Fifth Gospel — and indeed, it truly is. I'm so grateful that I could follow a course on biblical archaeology this September. It was an excellent time when I could experience the beauty and deep history of this land. I was able to witness the testimony of many places important for biblical

history, both in the Old and the New Testament.

Ancient cities such as Megiddo, Lachish, and Hazor tell a story of difficult times, full of wars and struggles for domination. On the other hand, Bethlehem,

Jerusalem, and Capernaum speak about Jesus' life and the beginnings of the Church. It was a beautiful and deeply moving experience.

Nevertheless, today the Holy Land longs for peace — perhaps more than many other places in the world. The city of Jerusalem, a crucial place for the three great religions — Judaism, Christianity, and Islam — is marked by divisions, attacks, and a lack of trust. This land truly needs our prayer.

During that time, when the streets and churches were almost empty due to the absence of pilgrims and tourists, I had the grace to pray and celebrate Mass in many different places, such as the Basilica of

the Nativity in Bethlehem and the Tomb of Jesus in Jerusalem. I remembered Saint Gilbert Parish in Grayslake and its pastor, Father Mario, and I kept you all deeply in my heart.

My biblical journey didn't end this September. I've started my studies in Rome again, and I'm going to continue deepening my knowledge of the Holy Bible. Thank you for your support and prayers — I will keep you in mine here in Rome. See you soon! —Fr. Damian











EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP


