


Adoration... In the midst of a chaotic world, Jesus waits for us in the quiet of the Blessed Sacrament. Come, spend time

And indeed, we have been condemned justly, for the sentence we received corresponds to our crimes,


but this man has done nothing criminal." Then he said,

EVERYDAY STEWARDSHIP

It would be kind of awesome to be a king or queen! Absolute rule, untold wealth, and people answering your every beck and call are things that wouldn't be half bad. Of course, I would be a benevolent monarch, and I would hope that all my subjects would love me. They could cheer me as I came out of the palace, and I think my popularity ratings in the polls would be through the roof. But if they weren't, that would be fine, too, because I would rule the kingdom. And that means no throwing me

out of office. Talk about job security!

As great as that sounds, the King of kings could have had all that as well, but instead, he chose quite a different path. He gave up absolute



rule so all his subjects could have the free will to choose to follow him. He gave up untold wealth so he could be treated like a common criminal and receive a death sentence.
